<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Bur. of Medical Marijuana Regulation (BMMR) •Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act •Governor Appointment •Authority to create, issue, renew, discipline, suspend, or revoke licenses for the transportation, storage unrelated to manufacturing activities, distribution, and sale of MM •Require each licensing authority to report to BMMR suspension or revocation of a license •Engaging in commercial MM activity without a license is subject to civil and criminal penalties •May appoint an Advisory Committee •Establish license /renewal fees •\$10 million GF loan for start up •Provide public info on licensees •Contract for study on effect of cannabis on motor skills •Requires fingerprints for applicants •May deny license w 30 day appeal 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Declared Ag Product •CDFA has authority to create, issue, renew, discipline, suspend, or revoke licenses •Issue Unique Identifiers •w/DPR to dev. stds for use of pesticides, max tolerance for pest / foreign objects •Create Medical Cannabis Cultivation Program •Require permit from city/county •Require cultivators to package in tamper-evident packaging, use unique identifier, label the product, and prohibits packages and labels from being made attractive to children •Monitor H2O diversion or discharge with SWRCB and DFW •Req. CDFA w/BMMR to develop certified organic designation and organic certification program •Authorizes BMMR to establish appellations of origin •CDFA to create an electronic tracking database (Track and Trace) •Establish license /renewal fees- License valid for 12 months •Cannot be located within 600 feet of a school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •CDPH to license manufacturers establish fees and fines •Promulgate regulations for implementation of CDPH responsibilities (manufacture/edibles) •Edibles declared to be “not a food” & “not a drug” •Edibles defined as manufactured cannabis for human consumption •Only generic food names to be used to describe edible medical cannabis products •CDPH has authority to issue, renew, discipline, suspend, or revoke licenses •May participate in BMMR Advisory Committee •Require all manufacturers to package all medical cannabis products in tamper-evident packaging, use a unique identifier, label the product, and prohibits MM packages and labels from being made to be attractive to children and specific health warnings •CDPH inspects records of Manufacturers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Registered/licensed by CDPH •Promulgate regulations for implementation of CDPH Lab Testing Responsibilities (methods/QA/testing protocols) •CDPH has authority to issue, renew, discipline, suspend, or revoke licenses and adopt fee •Performs tests of cannabis or products w/ chain of custody controls •Accredited by specific orgs. Must notify CDPH within 1 day of loss of accreditation •Provide Certificate of Analysis •Testing, calibration and sampling activities consistent with ISO/IEC 17020 & ISO/IEC 17025 •Testing must occur prior to sending to dispensary or any other business •Determine how often cannabis is to be tested •Establish license /renewal fees •Licensees must destroy samples/product not meeting health/safety standards and not able to be mitigated •CDPH inspects records of testing labs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Licensed to purchase cannabis (cultivator) or products (manufacturer) for sale to dispensary or manufacturer •Conduct quality assurance and send to testing lab •Verifies quantity and content for manufacture or retail •Tracking for tax purposes •Must be bonded and insured 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Licensed for retail sale •Facility where medical cannabis, products or delivery devices are offered for retail sale •Deliveries can only be made by a dispensary pursuant to local ordinance •Requires a dispensary to implement security measures to deter theft of, medical cannabis or medical cannabis products. Require a dispensary to notify the licensing authority and law enforcement within 24 hours after discovering breaches of security •DCA creates storage requirements •Cannot be located within 600 feet of a school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Req. to complete an electronic shipping manifest and to transmit to BMMR and receiving licensee •Required to maintain a copy of the manifest while transporting •Req. transmittal to licensee of verification of receipt •Local jurisdiction shall not prohibit transportation of medical cannabis by licensed transporters on public roads •Security requirements for delivery and transportation
